Count in multiples of 6, 7, 9, 25 and 100 and backwards to include negative numbers
Recall times tables to 12 x 12
Recognise the place value of each digit in a four digit number and round to the nearest 10, 100, 1000 and decimals to the nearest whole number
Recognise Roman numerals to 100 (I-C)
Add and subtract numbers with 4 digits and multiply 3 digit x 1 digit numbers using written methods
Recognise and write decimal equivalents to fractions
Find the area of shapes
Convert between units of measure and between analogue and digital times
Identify obtuse and acute angles and lines of symmetry in 2D shapes

History

Devise and investigate historically valid questions about change, cause, similarity and difference, and significance
Construct informed responses that involve thoughtful selection and organisation of relevant historical information
