

## Sports Premium at Wilson September 2016

Wilson Primary School has been in receipt of additional government funding specified as 'Sport Premium' since its introduction in September 2013. For the 2016/17 academic year each school in England is expecting to receive £8000 plus £5 per child on roll.

We aim to utilise this extra funding to improve all aspects of Physical Activity. This includes maximising pupil progress, increasing participation in sport, professional development of staff and helping all our pupils to develop healthy lifestyles and positive attitudes towards Physical Education.

At Wilson Primary School, we recognise the contribution of PE to the health and well-being of the children. We believe that an innovative, varied PE curriculum and extra-curricular opportunities have a positive influence on the concentration, attitude and academic achievement of all our children.

Last academic year, 2015/16 we spent our 'Sports Premium' in the following ways:

This year the Sport's Premium Funding will enable us to continue and extend our provision. The role of the 'Teaching Assistant in Charge of Sport' is not a role that covers teaching sessions instead we use this role to enhance the teaching of PE across the school and develop teaching skills through team teaching and sharing of best practice. We also use this role to support the assessment and the development of PE skills across the age ranges. This member of staff is in addition to our Quality First

Teaching approach delivered by all teachers across the school and as such we see an impact on:

- Participation both in school and sign-posting to external clubs
- The wide range of school provision of clubs in addition to the PE the Curriculum
- The children's understanding of what it is to be healthy.

During the 2016/17 academic year, the sports premium funding will provide:

- Playtime equipment to be used at lunchtimes to support active play
- A continuation of the large variety of clubs on offer to children across the age ranges
- A contribution to cover the cost of swimming in Yr3
- Transport to and entry fees for local inter-schools' competitions
- Specialist health experts to enhance the PE curriculum such as dieticians and physiotherapists
- Reorganise sports day into two events, infants and juniors and resource materials to enhance the day
- Develop 'Health Week' for children to experience different sports, healthy eating workshops and understanding of healthy life styles
- Purchase of new and replacement PE equipment
- Purchase of a new PE storage unit
- The continuation of the 'Teaching Assistant in Charge of Sport' role.
