

Topic: Around the world	Learning Opportunities			
Literacy & Communication (Speaking and listening, language and literacy)	 Write a post card and send it to school talking about a trip or visit you have been on	Write a story set in a different country or location. Who could your characters be?	Research the author Oliver Jeffers and read some of his books 	Get a relative or friend from another country to visit our blog and leave a comment on the sticky post 'Who are you and where are you from?'
Maths & Problem Solving (Maths, thinking skills, Logic, Problem solving)	Use 2D shapes to make a plane shape. Can you use less than 5 shapes? How many different planes can you create? 	Talk to friends or relatives about where they've travelled to around the world. Then make a graph or table to show most popular continent or country	Use different coins and see how many ways you can spend £1. Can you find all the different ways? 	Create some problems involving animal legs and feet using +, -, x and ÷. For example: <i>There are 5 penguins. How many feet will there be?</i>
Science and the Outside environment (Science, PE, Healthy lifestyles, Eco issues and investigation)	Taste from different foods from around the world and talk about what you liked /disliked and why.	Create a paper plan and measure how far it can fly (does a lighter / heavier paper make it faster/slower or go a shorter/longer distance)	Find 10 foods in the supermarket that come from the same country. Write what they are and draw/ photograph them. 	Draw or write some facts about an animal or habitat that interests you 
Humanities and Citizenship (RE, History, Geography, Moral & Social and Economic Awareness)	Write some facts about another country on paper or using the form 'Around the world' on the blog 	Look at transport from the past- think about whether it has stayed the same or changed: why? 	Consider different religious celebrations from around the world and make a poster telling us about them.	Choose an inventor or scientist and think about how their work has changed the world.
Creative Arts (Art, Design & technology, Music, Drama & Dance)	Design your own mode of transport. You could make it out of different building materials or just draw a picture.	Design a holiday brochure page for a place of your choice. You could draw pictures, print them off of the internet or cut them out from magazines	 Listen to music from another country and create your own dance	Design an outfit that you would wear to represent a country: be as creative as you want!
