

Topic: In the woods	Learning Opportunities			
Literacy & Communication (Speaking and listening, language and literacy)	Write diary pretending to be a woodland animal 	Use fairy tales like Hansel and Gretel or Little Red Riding Hood as inspiration for your own woodland themed story	Write a blog post to tell us some interesting facts about the woods. 	Create a fact file about your favourite woodland animal
Maths & Problem Solving (Maths, thinking skills, Logic, Problem solving)	Measure the heights of plants / trees / sticks and order them 	Solve this problem in as many ways as possible: There are 30 legs in the woods. How many animals could you have?	How many different shapes can you half or quarter? 	Create your own calculation problems linked to the woods For example: A tree was 25m tall and 5m was chopped off, how much is left? I saw 10 badgers and 18 foxes, how many animals in total did I see?
Science and the Outside environment (Science, PE, Healthy lifestyles, Eco issues and investigation)	Take on the role of an animal detective and work out which animals you can find based on their footprints.	Track the weather over a month- what do you notice? 	Visit the woods or a park. Describe your experience using your senses	Go on a picnic and write about the food you ate or design your own picnic menu 
Humanities and Citizenship (RE, History, Geography, Moral & Social and Economic Awareness)	 Design a journey of a woodland animal. You could make a map of their route or write instructions	Compare different woodland areas around the world- focus on their locations. What's the same and what's different?	Design a poster about how you can be respectful in the woods 	Find or take some photographs of different trees and plants you can find in the UK
Creative Arts (Art, Design & technology, Music, Drama & Dance)	Create a woodland shelter for you or an animal 	Draw or make a picture of the woods. You can use a range of materials or paint 	Create your own music using nature to inspire you	Make an animal mask 

Remember to choose at least 1 activity from each row (1 from Literacy & Communication, 1 from Maths & Problem solving, 1 from Science, 1 from Humanities and 1 from Creative arts).
