<p><b>Maths &amp; Problem Solving</b> (Maths, thinking skills, Logic, Problem solving)</p>	<p><b>Activity 5</b> Data collection - ask family/friends what fireworks and their colour they and record this in a bar chart.</p>	<p><b>Activity 6</b> Create a mathematical board game with a firework theme.</p> 	<p><b>Activity 7</b> Create some addition, subtraction, multiplication and division word problems which are based on fireworks.</p>	<p><b>Activity 8</b> Plan a bonfire party with a budget of £100 Keep a record of all you have spent and what your party will include.</p>

(Please do not copy and paste information straight from the internet!)</p>
<p><b>Humanities and Citizenship</b> (RE, History, Geography, Moral &amp; Social and Economic Awareness)</p>	<p><b>Activity 13</b> <b>Create a quiz</b> to test the class on their knowledge of The Gunpowder Plot.</p>	<p><b>Activity 14</b> Create a leaflet which explains how different religions use fireworks or lights in their celebrations.</p> 	<p><b>Activity 15</b> Explain how different countries use fireworks in celebrations across the world.</p>	<p><b>Activity 16</b> Find some differences and similarities between the Catholic and Church of England religion. Record your findings in a table.</p>
<p><b>Creative Arts</b> (Art, Design &amp; technology, Music, Drama &amp; Dance)</p>	<p><b>Activity 17</b> Create a vibrant fireworks picture- you might use chalk, paint, collaging or another media.</p>	<p><b>Activity 18</b> Create a model of Razvani's Fire Grotto, for the story 'The Firework Makers Daughter' which we have read in depth in class.</p>	<p><b>Activity 19</b> Create a dance to a firework themed song.</p> 	<p><b>Activity 20</b> Create and design your own firework rocket using recycled materials from home.</p>
