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Write a story with the title "The Ice Palace".




Write a mini toolkit before you start to make sure you remember all the high level features that you would use in class.

- How much does a snowball weigh? Use grams and Kilograms.
- Put the snowball in a container, estimate how much liquid there will be when it has melted. Measure in millilitres and litres.

Make a snowman out of snow. Draw a picture of your creation. Label your picture with amazing descriptive language.

Make a model of a 3D snowman. You could use clay, junk modelling materials, paper and card.

Find a biscuit recipe. Make the biscuits. Can you make the shape of the biscuits link to the weather?
